

Explore another approach for non-small cell lung cancer (NSCLC)

The **ROSETTA Lung-202 Trial (CA266-0002)** is a Phase 3 clinical trial testing how safe and effective a proposed treatment is for adults with locally advanced or metastatic NSCLC (cancer that has spread to nearby tissue or other parts of the body). This trial will compare the investigational treatment against the current standard-of-care (SOC) treatment (treatment that is accepted and widely used by healthcare professionals), as first-line therapy for adults with locally advanced or metastatic NSCLC with high levels of PD-L1 (a protein found on some cells in the body that can prevent the immune system from targeting cancer cells), who are not candidates for surgery or chemoradiation.

Clinical trials seek to advance and improve treatment options for a variety of conditions, including NSCLC. Phase 3 trials confirm findings from previous trials in much larger groups and evaluate the safety and effectiveness of the investigational treatment.

Clinical research and participation in clinical trials is needed to address the need for more effective therapies in advanced or metastatic NSCLC.

Key trial details

- **What's being studied?** An investigational treatment called pumitamig, which will be compared against an SOC treatment (treatment that is accepted and widely used by healthcare professionals)
- **Who can participate?** Adults with locally advanced or metastatic NSCLC who are not candidates for surgery or chemoradiation
 - **Locally advanced:** Cancer that has spread from where it started to nearby tissue
 - **Metastatic:** Cancer that has spread to other parts of the body
- **How long is this trial?** The trial treatment period may last up to 2 years, with the total length of trial participation depending on the participant's response to the trial treatment

Your trial-related costs will be covered, including visits, laboratory tests, and procedures. You may also be eligible for reimbursement for your time, travel, or transportation.
